Insurance has always been confusing especially when it comes to eye care. It's possible you may have **Vision Insurance** in addition to your **Medical Insurance**.

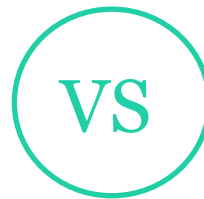

Vision Insurance

Vision insurance is designed to pay towards a "routine" eye exam that checks for, but finds no medical problems.

Determining your eyeglasses prescription is included in a "routine" exam. Vision insurance often pays a portion of eyeglasses or contacts.

Most vision plans do not pay towards the contact lens fitting, but may offer a discount.

Medical insurance pays for eye exams and surgical procedures that are for medical treatment.
